## Naturalist Domico publishes field guide to region

Naturalist and author Terry Domico has published a field guide to the San Juan archipelago and the Salish Sea bioregion.

"Natural Areas of the San Juan Islands," published by Turtleback Books, was in the works for 18 years. It distills a life of study and conservation biology to 60 of the very best natural areas that are accessible to the public and durable enough to mention.

A conservation biologist living in the San Juans for the past 37 years, Domico has explored nooks and crannies unheard of by just about everyone else. He's built an enormous database of information about the ecology of the area. For each site, the book "goes into the geology, the human history and then I profile the area," he said. "I tell why it's important."

The book has 216 pages, including original maps. It is a durable paperback and will be available at local bookstores Sept. 15.

Domico is known for his regional ecological assessment work for the conservation and enhancement of critical native plant and wildlife habitats.

He is the author of several other books on nature, including "Wild Harvest," "Bears of the World," "Kangaroos: The Marvelous Mob," and "The Last Thylacine" and "The Nature of Borneo."
